

World Shooting and Recreation Complex (WSRC) in Sparta  
**Guidelines for Transferring Awarded Firearms to Competitors & Drawing Winners**

*The exemption provided in 430 ILCS 65/3a(b-5) does not apply because the event is complete and the firearm is not going to be used for the purpose of the event.*

## **Transfer Options Based upon State of Residency**

### **Illinois Resident (FOID CARD REQUIRED)**

- Transfer of a handgun will be conducted by the FFL to the winning Illinois resident. The transfer will include the winner filling out an ATF Form 4473, the FFL calling in the transaction to the Illinois State Police Firearm Transfer Inquiry Program (FTIP), and a 72-hour waiting period from the time the winner was announced. The handgun will not be released to the winner until the FFL receives an “Approval” number from FTIP.
- Transfer of a long gun (Shotgun or Rifle) will be conducted by the FFL to the winning Illinois resident. The transfer will include the winner filling out an ATF Form 4473, the FFL calling in the transaction to the Illinois State Police FTIP, and a 24-hour waiting period from the time the winner was announced. The long gun will not be released to the winner until the FFL receives an “Approval” number from FTIP.

### **Contiguous State (IN, WI, IA, MO, and KY)**

- Transfer of a handgun to a non-resident of Illinois will be conducted by the FFL transferring the handgun to an FFL in the home state of the non-resident winner. This may be accomplished by the FFL licensed as an FFL in the home state of the winner coordinating with the FFL at the WSRC who currently possesses the handgun. The handgun will be shipped to the winner’s home state FFL. Upon returning to the winner’s home state FFL, the winner may complete the transaction with the home state FFL per federal, state, and local regulations in their home state.
- Transfer of a long gun (Shotgun or Rifle) to a contiguous state winner will be conducted by the WSRC FFL who currently possesses the long gun. The winner will complete an ATF Form 4473 and then the FFL will call in an out of state contiguous buyer to the Illinois State Police FTIP. A 24-hour waiting period from the time the winner was announced will be observed. The long gun will not be released to the winner until the FFL receives an “Approval” number from FTIP.

### **Non-contiguous State**

- Transfer of a handgun to a non-resident of Illinois will be conducted by the FFL transferring the handgun to an FFL in the home state of the non-resident winner. This may be accomplished by the FFL, licensed as an FFL in the home state of the winner, coordinating with the FFL at the WSRC who currently possesses the handgun. The handgun will be shipped to the winner’s home state FFL. Upon returning to the winner’s home state FFL, the winner may complete the transaction with the home state FFL per federal, state, and local regulations.

- Transfer of a long gun (Shotgun or Rifle) to a non-contiguous state winner will be conducted by the WSRC FFL, who currently possesses the long gun. The long gun will be shipped to the winner's home state FFL. Upon returning to the winner's home state FFL, the winner may complete the transaction with the home state FFL per federal, state, and local regulations.
- Transfer of a long gun (Shotgun or Rifle) to a non-contiguous state winner may be conducted on site, if the winner possesses a current Illinois non-resident hunting license. The winner must present the Illinois non-resident hunting license to the WSRC FFL who currently possesses the long gun. The winner will complete an ATF Form 4473 and then the FFL will call in an out of state non-contiguous buyer with an Illinois non-resident hunting license to the Illinois State Police FTIP. A 24-hour waiting period from the time the winner was announced will be observed. The long gun will not be released to the winner until the FFL receives an "Approval" number from FTIP.

NOTE: A parent or guardian may acquire a firearm as a gift for juvenile (less than 18 years of age) for lawful purposes as prescribed in 18 U.S.C. 922(b)(1) and ATF Publication 5300.4.
